

# UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS AND GUIDELINES

The formal uniform is compulsory for all official events, school opening and closing, school visits, visits of officials to the school, photo sessions, and events announced by the school and when explicitly requested by email.

\* Students can use elements from the formal uniform as casual uniform. \*\* Students are not allowed to wear sports shoes while wearing formal or casual uniforms.

#### Uniform For Grades 5-7 / Year 7-9



#### Boys formal uniform for Grades 5-7 / Year 7-9

Formal blazer, formal trousers, white formal shirt, school tie, black formal shoes, dark socks.

#### Girls formal uniform for Grades 5-7 / Year 7-9

Formal blazer, formal skirt, white formal shirt, school tie, white socks/white pantyhose, black formal shoes. \**The length of the skirt should be no shorter than 2 cm above the knee.* 

#### Boys casual uniform for Grades 5-7 / Year 7-9

Casual trousers, cotton shirt with short or long sleeves, yellow jumper with a green stripe or green cardigan, dark or black casual shoes.

#### Girls casual uniform for Grades 5-7 / Year 7-9

Casual trousers, cotton shirt with short or long sleeves, yellow jumper with a green stripe or green cardigan, dark or black casual shoes.





#### Uniform For Grades 8-10 / Year 10-12

#### Boys formal uniform for Grades 8-10 / Year 10-12

Formal blazer, formal trousers, white formal shirt, school tie, black formal shoes, dark socks.

#### Girls formal uniform for Grades 8-10 / Year 10-12

School skirt, white formal shirt, school tie, blazer, white socks/white pantyhose, black formal shoes. \*The length of the skirt should be no shorter than 2 cm above the knee.

#### Boys casual uniform for Grades 8-10 / Year 10-12

Casual trousers, cotton shirt with short or long sleeves, yellow jumper with a green stripe or green cardigan, dark or black casual shoes.

#### Girls casual uniform for Grades 8-10 / Year 10-12

Casual trousers, cotton shirt with short or long sleeves, yellow jumper with a green stripe or green cardigan, dark or black casual shoes.



# UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS AND GUIDELINES



#### Uniform for Grades 11-12 / Year 13-14

Students in Grade 11 and 12 (Year 13 –14) do not have a prescribed uniform, instead students are expected to set an example to the rest of the School through their high standard of business-like dress and the way they present themselves.

All students in Grade 11 and 12 (Year 13 –14) are expected to follow the guidance of 'smart business-like attire'.

Boys should wear trousers, shirt, tie, optional jacket/blazer, black or brown formal shoes, jumper (optional), waistcoat (optional).

Girls should wear trousers (must reach the ankle), skirt (no shorter than 2 cm above the knee and not figure hugging), blouse, jacket/blazer, black or brown formal shoes (maximum heel height 5cm), formal sleeved dress (summertime only).

The following are not allowed: jeans/denim, offensive slogans/words, revealing/transparent clothing, overly colourful or "loud" clothing not appropriate for a business-like environment. The following colours are not acceptable: pink, yellow, orange, metallic or with metal elements, too bright or contrasting colours. No underwear or elements of underwear should be visible, and students are not allowed to show cleavage.

#### Sports uniform for all grades - boys and girls

Shorts or tracksuit bottoms, t-shirt, tracksuit top, sports shoes, socks

#### Sports Uniform Grades 1-4 / Year 3-5

Tracksuit with red stripe.

#### Sports Uniform Grades 5-7 / Year 7-9

Tracksuit with green stripe.

#### Sports Uniform Grades 8-10 / year 10-12

Tracksuit with grey stripe.

#### Sports Uniform – 11-12 grade /Year 13-14

Tracksuit, shorts, T-shirt. No vests, crop-tops and leggings.

Students are expected to come to school dressed in either official or casual uniform and change into their sports uniform for PE lessons or for extracurricular activities organised by the school. The students have to wear sports shoes for their PE lessons. For hygiene reasons, students should change back into their official or casual uniform after PE.

#### Sports uniform - swimming

For boys - swimsuit, swimming cap, flip flops, towel, swimming goggles (recommended).

For girls - swimsuit (full or covering the middle part of the body), swimming cap, flip-flops, towel, swimming goggles (recommended).



## UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS AND GUIDELINES



#### Makeup, jewellery, hair, watches, etc.

St. George International School and Preschool understands that students may wish to express a degree of individuality. The school do not want to be over restrictive and therefore adopts a 'reactive' position. Students are welcome to express themselves as they wish provided they follow the following basic guidelines. Restrictions may be put in place if deemed necessary in the future.

Girls may wear light makeup if necessary. It should be subtle and not easily noticeable. Hair can be worn either tied up, or loose, except during PE or Science where it should be tied up.

Brightly coloured hair or highligts are not allowed. It is expected that the students maintain their natural hair colour during the school year.

Students' nails have to be short and may have subtle, discrete polish. No extreme colours, length or shape of nails.

Girls may have discrete ear piercings. No facial piercing is allowed. No loose or hanging decoration may be worn.

Nothing should be worn on the neck that could constitute a choking, or strangling hazard.

Watches may be worn but the school takes no responsibility for damage that may occur, they should be removed for PE. Smart Watches are to be handed to the class master in the morning, along with students' phones.

Students who come to school with the wrong uniform (depending on the case – official, casual or sports uniform) will receive a negative badge in Shkolo. This should be monitored by the class masters, Key Stage Leaders, Head of Primary, Head of Secondary every morning and PE teachers before the start of the lesson.

#### **1 negative badge – Warning.**

**2 negative badges** – a letter is sent home to the parents, reminding them of the policy.

**3 negative badges** – the student is provided with the respective school uniform/s (official, casual or sports uniform). In any case (for all students from 1 to 10 grade) the student is provided with the necessary elements of the school uniform and the parents/guardians receive an invoice for payment in the Payment Portal. The invoice should be paid within 7 days of its issue.

For grade 11 and 12 (Year 13-14) students the school reserves the right to decline access to the building, should their appearance be deemed inappropriate. Students will be allowed to resume lessons once their appearance is considered acceptable. In case a student is not allowed to classes for this reason, the consequences set out in the Attendance Policy and other school policies shall apply.

# MEDICAL AND HEALTH SERVICE

St. George International School and Preschool has qualified nurses on duty throughout the whole school day. All personnel and teachers are trained to provide first aid.

If during the medical examination of students, a child does not feel well and cannot be actively involved in the learning process, parents are contacted immediately. If a student is absent due to illness, parents must notify the school and provide a doctor's note specifying the child's health condition upon the student's return. In case of a contagious disease, parents should inform the school immediately, so that the school staff can notify the other parents.

As a part of the school medical services, St. George International School and Preschool organises several preventative check-ups for students throughout the academic year including:

-bone and spinal deformities -oral hygiene -hearing checks -eye testing -heart disease

After each preventive check parents will receive written feedback and recommendations.

# <u>SCHOOL</u> CANTEEN

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The students have access to the school canteen during their designated mealtimes, in accordance with an entry scheduled posted on the canteen door. We expect for our students to maintain an impeccable conduct, demonstrate good manners and keep their eating areas clean.

No electronic devices are allowed in the canteen.

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The students who do not follow these guidelines will be excluded from the library for a determined period of time.



The transport service is provided by the licensed carrier for children and students above 3 years of age on a door-to-door basis.
